

PE Report 2020-21

In 2019-20 our aims were:

- To continue for Sports leaders and all teachers to work together to increase physical fitness of all children across the school.

We will continue with this action as it was stopped in its infancy due to lockdown. We had success with the few sessions that took place at break and lunchtimes with lunchtime staff and children leading physical activities which increased physical activity.

- Increase the confidence and skills for staff and pupils in the areas identified in last year's audits. (Dance and Gymnastics)

We will continue this area for development. We are happy that we are supporting the staff due to continuing with Sally (Dance Teacher) and Leeds Rhinos. As well as this, full planning schemes of work have been provided by the PE Leaders for all of the PE Curriculum in each year group. We plan to do another Staff Questionnaire to gain feedback on future areas for CPD.

- To continue to increase competition within school and against other schools.

Competitions took place in most year groups last year before lockdown. This will not be an aim this year due to current guidelines.

- To target SEND participation in PE as well as overweight children.

We will continue with this area of development. We have begun the '30:30 Challenge' to increase physical activity. This is encouraging children to take part in 30 minutes of exercise throughout the school day and then 30 minutes at home. This is an initiative of Leeds Beckett University. The Child Sports Leaders will encourage this programme at break and lunch times too.

Throughout the 2020-21 academic year our aims will be:

- To continue for Sports leaders and all teachers to work together to increase physical fitness of all children across the school.
- Increase the confidence and skills for staff and pupils in the areas identified in last year's audits. (Dance and Gymnastics)
- To target SEND participation in PE as well as overweight children.
- To encourage teachers to become better facilitators in encouraging children to express their opinions and ideas when evaluating skills or routines in PE.

This will be done through the continued work with Leeds Rhinos and the Northern Arts Factory who help improve our physical fitness and intensity of our PE sessions, the whole school 30:30 Challenge and increasing the Dance knowledge and providing our staff with valuable CPD.

To do this the PE funding will be spent in the following way in order for us to achieve our 2020-21 aims:

Expenditure (full year)	Amount	Impact
Leeds Rhinos (contracted until March 2020)	£7,870	<u>CPD for staff</u> All children throughout the year will receive a term of Specialist PE lessons led by a Leeds Rhinos Instructor.
Northern Arts Factory (Dance)	£9,500	<u>CPD for staff</u> Dance is still one of the least confident areas of PE within our school to be taught by teachers. Links with parents and carers through links to topic and a showcase at the end of the term. As well as this, every child receives a term of high quality Dance taught by The Northern Arts Factory. We are working on how this can be shown to the parents (Google Classroom or the School Website) under the government restrictions.
PE equipment	£130	Necessity for sport and physical activity to take place to stimulate children's participation. Used by Sports Leaders to increase participation.
Skipping4Schools	£1,100	Part of Little London's fitness week- to engage and promote the participation of physical activity and fitness within school. In previous years, these inset days have been infectious for the breeding of physical activity around school.
Active Schools membership	£1,200	Opportunities for CPD and participation in events and competitions.
